People: No, but we have sinned against him in thought, word and

deed.

Minister: Then let us confess our sins to the Lord for with him there is

mercy and abundant redemption.

Lord, we come to you, as the poor tax collector that stood far off and would not even lift up his eyes to heaven, but beat his breast; and we pray his prayer, "God, be merciful to us sinners." God of infinite mercy, be merciful to us! O wash us thoroughly from our iniquity, and cleanse us from our sin; for we know our transgressions, and our sin is ever before us.

O purge us with hyssop, and we shall be clean; wash us, and we shall be whiter than snow; hide your face from our sins, blot out all our iniquities, and remember our sins no more. All this we ask in the name of Jesus, our Prophet, Priest, and King, who has conquered Satan, sin, and death through his death and resurrection, and who taught us to pray, saying:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil, for thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever. Amen.


