devil has been sinning from the beginning.

Minister: The reason the Son of God appeared was to destroy the works

he has been born of God.

the children of the devil: whoever does not practice righteousness is not of God, nor is the one who does not love

Minister: Have we fully obeyed the Lord in all that he has commanded

us?

People: No, but we have sinned against him in thought, word, and

deed.

Minister: Then let us confess our sins to the Lord for with him there is

mercy and abundant redemption.

Give ear, O Shepherd of Israel, you who lead your people like a flock! You who are enthroned upon the cherubim, shine forth. Stir up your might, and come to save us! Restore us, O God; let your face shine, that we may be saved!

Do not be angry, Lord, but hear our prayer. For we have sinned against you and done what is evil in your sight. We have turned aside from your glory, and have walked in darkness, preferring the lies of the world, the flesh and the devil, to the light of your glorious truth. Restore us, O Lord God of hosts! Let your face shine, that we may be saved!
